

ABSTRACT SPELLING RULES

The abstracts shall be submitted only via the online abstract system. All abstracts must be submitted and presented in English. All abstracts must be prepared using the abstract submission guidelines. Presenting author should have to make a registration as a participant. The presenting author is required to ensure that all co-authors are aware of the content of the abstract before submission. Abstracts submitted after the deadline will not be accepted.

Title: Only the first letter of the abstract title should be in capital letters (max 120 characters). Avoid abbreviations and formula where possible.

Author names and affiliations: The Name and the address of the institution, in which the author is employed, should be stated. The Abstracts has to contain the name and last name of the authors. In the names of the authors should not include their academic titles. The names should be written with only the first letter in capital and the rest in small letters. Indicate the authors' affiliation addresses (where the actual work was done) with numbered superscript letter immediately after the author's name and in front of the appropriate address.

Abstract Structure: The abstract length should not exceed 250 words excluding the abstract title, name and surname of the author and affiliation. The text should be written in one paragraph. The purpose of the paper and the methods applied should be explained in brief, the findings should be summarized together with sufficient statistical details and the conclusion should be stated within the framework of the findings presented. In the abstract, a reference is identified by means of a number between brackets that should be placed at the end of a sentence before the punctuation. References (max. 3) can be added. Reference will be written according to the Vancouver Style. In case abbreviation is used in the abstract, the abbreviations should be explained in parenthesis upon first occurrence. A structured abstract should not include figures or tables. Please use the recommended SI units.
